Message from the Chair

If a disaster were to strike in our area, would you be ready? Do you have a central out-of-state phone number for locating your family members? Do you know who your neighbors are and if they have any special needs?

The City has told us countless times that in the event of a major disaster, we should all be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 3 days. That could mean no electricity, no gas, no water, no food, and no medical supplies will be available for quite a long time. Take a moment to think about each of these things and how you would cope without them.

SNAP (Sunnyvale Neighborhoods Actively Prepare) is a free 7week program offered quarterly by the City to train people to help themselves and their neighbors immediately after a disaster. Some of the subject matter is:

Disaster Preparedness

Fire Safety & Suppression

Incident Command System

- Understanding Terrorism
- Disaster Medical Operations

Critical Incident Stress Management & START Triage

Safety Assessment & Light Search and Rescue

Hands-on Disaster Exercise

Document Shredding Events

Safely recycle your old paperwork Shredding events will be held at the Sunnyvale Materials Recovery and Transfer (SMaRT) Station for residents from its partner cities: Mountain View, Palo Alto and Sunnyvale. The SMaRT Station is located at 301 Carl Road, Sunnyvale, CA 94089.

2011 Shredding Events:

- Saturday, April 30 - Saturday, July 30 - Saturday, December 3 Shredding events are for residential customers only; proof of residency will be required.

How residents can participate in the shredding events:

- Gather and box up materials such as personal and financial documents that you want to shred.
- Bring up to 5 banker-sized boxes (or brown paper bags) to each shredding event.
- Remove documents from binders and binder clips (these can damage the shredding equipment); however, paperclips, staples, spiral notebooks and rubber bands are acceptable.
- Recycle all non-confidential documents and paper curbside in your recycling cart.

What to expect when you arrive at the event:

- Volunteers will direct traffic and assist with off-loading boxes.
- All collected materials will be shredded on site. (You may stay to watch your materials be shredded.)

- Shredded materials will be recycled into useful paper products. *Wendy Hediger*

Neighbors Concerned

On February 26th, a water pipe blew out in the 700 block of Borregas with such power it caused water pipe caps to pop up in 800 block of Borregas and Carolina Avenues. This is one block from the #132 gas transmission line that runs under our neighborhood and on up to San Bruno where it exploded a few months ago. The enclosed pictures tell the water pipe story, but it also brings to mind questions about the gas line.

Saturday, February 26, 2011. Water pipe cap poppep up 800 Blocks of Borregas and Carolina Avenues. Could the same conditions that caused wear of the water line also be causing wear on the gas line? Does anyone in authority in Sunnyvale even know where the gas line shut off valve(s) is for our neighborhood? A part of the magnitude of the San Bruno disaster was that they couldn't get the shut off valve closed for one and one-half hours allowing gas to continue feeding the fire. I want our neighbors and governing body to be aware of this situation and stay on top of it, getting as much information as we can to keep our neighborhood safe. Connie Cook-Turner

Local Men's Chorus Offers Free Vocal Training Clinic The Peninsulaires Men's Chorus is offering a free vocal training program for men who would like to improve their singing skills. Most people who enjoy singing have never had formal voice training. This unique program is designed for those singers. It will be taught by instructors qualified in the a cappella style (without instrumental accompaniment). This style helps singers isolate their voices, learn how to tune them properly and use them correctly to create an enjoyable sound.

This complementary six-week clinic will run from Tuesday evening, March 29th through Tuesday, May 3rd. It will provide real world, hands on training in the use of that incredible instrument called the human voice. The program will address topics like: how to properly "warm up" the voice; the importance of posture; the use of the body's resonance chambers; preventing getting hoarse; the impact of pronunciation on audience enjoyment, and much more. Each lesson will be approximately 90 minutes in length, and students can attend any or all of the six lessons. A weekly agenda of lesson topics will be provided to each student upon registration. Training sessions will be conducted by the team of Steve Sammonds, Certified Chorus Director of The Peninsulaires for the past 20 years, and Paul Eastman, Certified Vocal Coach and 41year member of the Barbershop Harmony Society. Lessons will be held at The First United Methodist Church of Sunnyvale, located at 550 Old San Francisco Road (just west of Fair Oaks) in Sunnyvale. Sessions will begin at 7:30 p.m. The Peninsulaires chorus is part of the Palo Alto-Mountain View Chapter of The Barbershop Harmony Society, a non-profit music education organization. The chorus has been active for over 60 years. The 40+ man chorus shares the joy of barbershop harmony through charity functions and community performances, including their annual cabaret show and theatrical production. They provide training in a cappella singing at local high schools and middle schools, and through periodic free voice training clinics. Their weekly rehearsals are open to the public.
