Consistently attending the monthly meetings is critical to being an officer-volunteer. Assuming we get at least one more nominee, we will hold elections at the December 1 general meeting. We've never been in a position before where we went into a new year without all four officers. We need at least one nominee for the secretary

position or we have a problem. If you're interested in helping out by being an officer but you don't want to be secretary, please nominate yourself for another office. This could enable the other nominees to possibly switch to volunteer for one of the other offices so we will have a full line-up going into the postponed elections on December 1. If you are not particular about which office you serve in, please list all positions you would accept nominations for. This is because we are now using a voting method where a person who does not win the election for a particular office may then go and run again for a different office.



Brief Summary of November General Meeting


- 1. The Red Bow Event will be 12/3, beginning with a 9:00 Am Breakfast Social at Jim & Connie Cook-Turner's.

Sunnyvale Armory Site



There is currently a proposal to convert the existing Armory site at 620 E. Maude Ave., between Wolfe and Fair Oaks into low income housing. MidPen Housing Corporation and Charities Housing Development Corporation have requested a rezone of the existing parcel from "Industrial to Residential Medium Density" to "Very High Density Residential" in order to accommodate a proposed 4-story, 124-unit housing project.

Neighbor To Neighbor

Hi! This is your neighbor, Connie Cook-Turner, reaching out to you again about neighborhood leadership. Individual neighbors, as Block Reps, hand-deliver the S.N.A.I.L. Newsletter to over 1200 homes every month. Each time we have an event, we see about 200 people attending and enjoying the event; and about ten people setting-up, working, and taking down at the end. We have neighbors helping neighbors on a one-on-one basis. Still others are serving on various City Boards and Commissions, and we have a great team that serves the homeless at the Armory every Winter. But, we can't find four people willing to serve on the S.N.A.I.L. Neighborhood Association Board for one year: twelve monthly meetings, about two hours each. We were unable to hold our Annual Board Election at the November meeting, due to a shortage of candidates. Our Bylaws state that if you are an active Block Rep delivering our Newsletters, OR have attended two of the last four General Meetings (Sept, Oct, Nov, Dec.) you are eligible to hold office. 
