# Message from the Chair

Occasionally a frustrated neighbor contacts me about a complaint they've made to the City or a utility that still is not resolved. Sometimes I'm told by the neighbor that they've called many times and have gotten no results. While gathering information so that I can help the person, I usually ask the same questions: When did you call? What were the dates? Who did you speak to? What did you speak about? What did they say they would do for you? Rarely do I get past my question number one.

Making complaints by telephone (and email) can be effective if it is done correctly. Number one, you must keep an organized and detailed record of each call. Do not make the assumption that your first complaint will be the end of the issue. Keep a call log. Note the date and time. Note the name of the person you spoke to. Note what you spoke about and especially what the person said they would do next. If they said they would call you back, make a note of it. If you need to call again, mention most of the details from your first call so the second person who takes your call can positively follow up on the first call. Again, write down the same information as your first call – date, time, name, subject, action items. If you need to call a third time, mention the details from the first two calls. And again, write down the same information the third time as well -- date, time, name, subject, action items.

If you still get no action, it's time to escalate. Maybe you can speak to a manager in the organization. If it's a City issue, you can contact our Neighborhood Resource Officer (listed in every issue of this newsletter). Whatever it is, you can call the SNAIL Chair. #### **SNAIL Survey Results**

#### Parents and Kids

My husband and I used to live in a different Sunnyvale neighborhood. The homes in our old neighborhood were priced at least a few hundred thousand dollars more than our SNAIL neighborhood. Not surprisingly the schools in our old neighborhood have better test scores. We have a young daughter and will need to decide about school soon. As families with small kids can probably relate, "The days are long, but the years are short."

I started listening to NPR not too long ago and noticed a lot of education discussions. The discussion about Diane Ravitch's book, "The Death and Life of the Great American School System: How Testing and Choice Are Undermining Education," made me think with so much emphasis on test scores and other statistics, is this causing us to not see the forest for the trees?

I grew up in a California farming town with many immigrant families, including ours. If they did state testing as they do now, my elementary school probably would not have been either the best or worst. Many kids were English-language learners, which most likely would've affected test scores. This is probably similar to where Bishop Elementary School falls, not the best or worst in Sunnyvale.

It seems to me that it would be beneficial if more kids went to schools in their own neighborhoods, leading to communities knowing their neighbors better, and kids wouldn't have to spend time commuting.

I would like to start a dialogue in SNAIL on whether kids in our local public schools are being successfully educated and challenged, and are in healthy, happy, well-rounded and safe environments. Feedback from administrators and parents with kids in our local public schools would be greatly appreciated, as the topic of preserving public education seems more relevant with each passing day.

# **Sunnyvale City Employee Pension Reform**

Last month we read a letter from SNAIL neighbor and City Council member, Pat Meyering, detailing the extraordinary salaries paid to city employees, and how these salaries have resulted in cuts to (city) staff and public services.

Yet there is another issue not mentioned, that of pensions and how these pensions are paid for. Simply put, if CalPERS (California Public Employee Retirement System) does not get its expected return on their investments, ...we the tax paying public must make up the difference.

As Councilman Meyering noted, the previous (Sunnyvale) City Manager, Amy Chan, receives a pension of \$216,000.00 per year, PLUS cost of living increases, PLUS benefits.

That is a whopping \$18,000.00 per month. Of course, there are other city retirees making enormous sums, in the \$100K plus range.

Currently there is a group in Sunnyvale committed to addressing and fixing this problem. It is Sunnyvale Pension Reform, <a href="http://www.sunnyvalepensionreform.com">http://www.sunnyvalepensionreform.com</a>.


