## Free Emergency Preparedness Course with City of Sunnyvale

Do you know what to do in case of an emergency? Are you equipped (tools, supplies, and knowledge), to be self-sufficient following a disaster? Did you know that the City of Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety offers its residents a **free 7-weeks course on Emergency Preparedness?** 

The purpose of The Sunnyvale Neighborhoods Actively Prepare (SNAP) program is to provide Sunnyvale residents with the tools to be self-sufficient for a minimum of 72 hours following a disaster. Program includes topics such as Department of Public Safety, Fire Safety & Suppression, Disaster Medical Operations, START Triage, Safety/Damage Assessment, Light Search & Rescue and much, much more. Take advantage of this free training as many SNAIL members already have. Next session starts on **September 13th.**

If you live in the SNAIL area and have attended a SNAP training in the past, we are looking for you. Our goal is to divide the SNAIL territory into areas that are small enough for neighborhood groups to handle in an emergency, typically 20-30 residences.

If possible, please move your car off the street on street sweeping days.


