
- **FREE Watercolor Class for Individuals with Disabilities (Age 8+)**, Every Thurs., 5:30-6:30 p.m. Location: Creative Arts Center, Paint Room, 550 E. Remington Drive. Dive into the vibrant world of watercolor painting! With step-by-step guidance, you'll develop your skills and confidence in the versatile medium. All materials are provided; just bring your creativity and a willingness to experiment! Participants must be independent with self care and able to attend program with a 5:1 participant to staff ratio or bring an attendant. Registration required. Email CNC for registration link.
- **Sunnyvale Community Services @ CNC**, Thursdays, 3:00 – 5:00 p.m. Drop by CNC lobby and meet with Sunnyvale Community Services staff to learn all the resources they have to offer such as food, financial assistance and so much more. No appt. necessary
- **FREE! Storytime at Magical Bridge Playground**, Fri. 1/2 at 11 a.m. Location: Fair Oaks Park, 540 N. Fair Oaks Avenue. Families of all ages are welcome to enjoy a 30-minute storytime in the all-inclusive Magical Bridge Playground stage.
- **Parents Helping Parents @ CNC**, Wed., 1/14, 9:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. If you are in need of resources or info. for a child with disabilities, staff with Parents Helping Parents, a non-profit organization that specializes in helping families with a child with disabilities, will be at CNC monthly, 2nd Wednesday, to assist families.
- **Free! Legal Clinic (Virtual)**, Thurs., 1/8, 1 to 4 p.m. In partnership with Asian Law Alliance, consult with an attorney on legal issue in the areas of immigration, housing, public benefits, and family law. Consultations average 30 minutes. This month, consultations will be virtual via Zoom or over the phone. Registration required, call CNC to register a minimum of 3 business days prior to clinic date.
- **FREE! Food Distribution @ CNC**, Wed., 1/28 – a monthly food distribution program that usually takes place on the fourth Wednesday, 4:15 - 5:15 p.m. New families will need to register on distribution day. A Farmer's Market model, participants must park, walk into the parking lot and bring re-usable bags for bulk produce, fruits and a cart for dry and canned goods, eggs, milk, etc. Each family will pick up about 100 lbs. of food. Location: Columbia Middle School staff parking lot, 739 Morse Avenue.
- **Zumba classes in CMS Multi-Purpose Room** – Tues. & Thurs. 6:30-7:30 pm. Adults 18+, high school students (14-17) with signed parent consent, students (age 8-13) with parent or guardian present. Suggested \$3 donation/class, no one turned away for lack of payment. No childcare; children may not wait in the facility.

• **Drop-In Fitness Room** – Regular hours - Monday - Friday, 3:30 - 8 p.m.; Saturday, 9 a.m.—12 p.m. - get active with cardio machines (treadmill, bikes, ellipticals), strength training machines and free weights. Bring water, towel and wear athletic shoes. \$1, Sunnyvale residents only. High school students with signed parent consent waiver. Middle school students are free, must attend with a paying parent/guardian. No childcare and children may not wait in the facility.

• **FREE! Youth Drop-In Basketball in CNC Gym** – Fridays, 7 – 10 p. m. - indoor youth drop-in basketball for middle and high school youth. Must have current school ID and signed parent consent form. Bring your own ball. Program will be canceled if no one shows after the first hour.

• **2026 Recreation Scholarship Program** - \$500 scholarship per youth, age 17 and under for families that qualify. Must reside in Sunnyvale and meet income criteria. Go to city website, Sunnyvale.ca.gov, and search "Recreation Scholarship" for application and details.

Gentle Reminder to Our Neighbors

We've received reports that food and fruit are being tossed over fences into neighboring yards where dogs are present. While this may be done with good intentions, it can create several risks:

- **Animal Safety:** Certain foods—even seemingly harmless fruits—can make dogs sick. Feeding someone else's pet without knowing their dietary needs can unintentionally cause harm.
- **Legal Considerations:** California law (Penal Code §597) prohibits actions that could injure an animal or interfere with its proper care.
- **Pest Concerns:** Leftover food in yards can attract rodents, raccoons, and other wildlife, leading to sanitation and safety issues for the entire neighborhood.

For everyone's well-being, please avoid tossing any food into another resident's yard. If you have concerns about a pet or need to communicate with a neighbor, we encourage a friendly conversation directly.

Thank you for helping keep our neighborhood safe, clean, and respectful for all, including pets.


