#### Traffic Study for Peery Park Development

The Peery Park Workshop was on January 21, 2015. The focus of the workshop was the traffic impact of all the recent and planned developments along Mathilda Ave. and Maude Ave. The firm hired by the city did all the traffic analysis assuming a Mary Ave. bridge overpass existed. Last I read in the newspaper, the Mary bridge overpass was stopped in the courts. Clearly all the new developments will be done long before the Mary bridge overpass is completed, if it is ever completed.
