Brief Summary of December General Meeting Minutes

Guest Speaker - Warren Scott, Music Director, Columbia Middle School: Warren spoke about Columbia School, our award-winning band and orchestra, and their upcoming trip.

Because of a Stanford University Partnership program, Columbia School has become the school of choice in this area. Enrollment is up, with at least 762 students expected next year.

Though demographics have been changing, currently 56% are Latino, 14% Filipino, 30% English-only speakers, 27% are non-English speakers and 58% are disadvantaged. Of the current enrollment, one-third are enrolled in music (245 students).

Our band and orchestra are currently in first place and our choir in second place. Our students hope to attend the Anaheim Heritage Festival at Fullerton College, with all awards presented at Disneyland.

TV Reception - Jim Quaderer: In addition to the reception issue, there were many comments and concerns related to this topic. Additional issues are privacy and light pollution as well as reception. John suggested we ask for a 2017 study at the quarterly meeting so there will be a policy in place. Perhaps as compensation the cable company bill could be paid for a period of time, like ten years. Jim made a motion that SNAIL take an official position on TV reception. Phyllis seconded the motion that "SNAIL is opposed to approval of tall buildings without compensation for residents who have lost or degraded TV reception." Twelve were for, one was opposed, and two abstained. The motion passed. Jim asked if SNAIL can start a "TV Reception" committee. Jim Quaderer was elected as Chairman of the "TV Reception" committee.

Christmas Contest – Connie Cook-Turner: Connie wants to reinstate the holiday decorating contest next year and put it on next year's agenda. Connie made a motion, June seconded it. Eleven were for, none were opposed, and four abstained. The motion passed.





Martin Luther King Day celebrates life and accomplishment of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. MLK promoted Civil Rights through nonviolent civil disobedience. He is perhaps best known for his 'I have a dream...' speech in 1963. He was assassinated in 1968. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day became a federally recognized holiday in 1983. The first year this holiday was observed was 1986, and not by all states. In 2000, it became a nationally observed holiday in all states. Martin Luther King Jr. Day takes place on the third Monday of January each year.
