HIGHLIGHTS OF LAST MONTH'S SNAIL GENERAL MEETING

Guest Speaker (Jim Reynolds, Vice President Heritage Park Museum): The Heritage Park Museum is eleven years old and completely run by volunteers. Volunteers raised the three million that built the house, an amazing accomplishment. In the near future, the museum will be expanded to include the contents of the Blue Cube. This extension will be built into the orchard and will involve cutting down six to ten apricot trees. The trees will be replanted elsewhere in the orchard.

The Museum is modeled after the Martin Murphy, Jr. home. Martin Murphy, Jr. was Sunnyvale's first European resident, emigrating from County Wessex, Ireland via Canada and Missouri. Leaving from Pocatello, Idaho, the family arrived in 1844, before the Donner Party. Their success was attributed to a Piute Indian, who helped them follow established Indian trade routes over the Sierras. They arrived with all fifty persons plus two babies born on the route. Also, a strong leader, Elisha Stevens (Steven's Creek), kept them from splitting up by holding councils and thus resolving disputes.

YAHOO GROUPS IS CHANGING

Yahoo is changing the format of the Yahoo Groups platform. Beginning on December 14, 2019, all Yahoo Groups will be made private and any content that was previously uploaded via the website will be removed. "DISTRICT MAP" FINAL EPISODE

Out of 26 viable maps that were originally submitted, Councilmembers selected the final unity map 120D on Tuesday, Nov. 12^{th} , for Sunnyvale.

Council chose the following sequencing pattern: districts 2, 4 and 6 to go first in 2020 because they claimed this is geographically balanced and fits a "checkerboard" pattern. This means that Districts 1, 3 and 5 will not be up for election until 2022. -*Valérie Suarès, SNAIL Chair*
