# HIGHLIGHTS OF LAST MONTH'S SNAIL ZOOM MEETING SNAIL Business

- **1. Yard sale (Tarik and Barbara):** Will be held at Tarik's home on June 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>, 9:00 a.m. 3:00 p.m. June, Bonnie and Valerie have donated items already for the yard sale.
  - From Denise's Shed: Tables, A-frames (Jenny has two of them)
  - Volunteers: Jenny, maybe Richard Mehlinger and Marco on Sunday. Tarik will manage the money; at the end he will take leftovers to Goodwill.
  - Marketing: Marco will post on NextDoor; Barbara will write a notice for newsletter.
  - Dorit: Will donate a small clothing rack.
- Dumpsters (Barry): The dumpster is close to Tarik's house. We have volunteers for dumpster watchers.
- **3. Earth Day Cleanup (April 25) report (Dorit and Barbara):** 40 adults and 9 children participated. 18 raffle prizes were given out. Collected about 3 tires, plus 75 lbs. of garbage. Some additional raffle prizes are available for next time. There were a lot of positive responses, and everybody had a great time.
- **4. Soil Sale (Jenny):** Sold 80 cu. ft. of soil from front yard (\$405). Advertised on NextDoor. Everyone returned the cubic foot bags for transporting soil.
- **5. Budget (Marco):** \$450 spent on Earth Day Cleanup project. Projecting \$600 cost on bows in fall. Another \$450 projected for a Fall Cleanup Day. Total \$1,500. A vote of the membership was taken to approve these expenditures. Vote passes with nine, yes.

A recent March 2021 FoodCycle survey showed that 79 percent of residents FoodCycle at least once a month and 63 percent do so each week. The FoodCycle program collects over 4,000 tons of food scraps annually. This reduces 2,000 metric tons of carbon dioxide each year, which is the same as taking 472 cars off the road.

WORLD World Oceans Day serves as a celebration of our oceans, which generate most of the oxygen that we breathe, feed us, and regulate the planet's climate. The day also serves to promote the oceans' UNWORLDOCEANSDAY.ORG contribution life and the need to protect

it from harmful pollution, overexploitation, destructive fishing, and climate change. Unfortunately, because of human pollution and exploitation, the world's oceans are becoming increasingly delicate.

In 1992, the Government of Canada proposed World Oceans Day at the Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro. By 2002, the Ocean Project, a nonprofit organization dedicated to conservation of the planet's oceans, began to promote, and coordinate the event on a global scale. Finally, in December of 2008, the United Nations General Assembly officially proclaimed June 8th as World Oceans Day.

#### **WORLD OCEANS DAY FACTS & QUOTES**

- The Earth is covered by water on 71% of its surface, 96.5% of that water is in the oceans.
- The theme for World Oceans Day in 2021 is "The Ocean: Life and Livelihoods".
- It is estimated that 50-80% of all life forms on Earth is found under the oceans' surfaces.
- If all the Earth's ice melted, the oceans would rise 66m and flood all low-lying ground.
- The lowest point on the planet is in Mariana's Trench in the western Pacific. The point, known as Challenger Deep, is 11,034m deep. (Mt. Everest is only 8,848m tall).

Recreation Fee Waiver Program for Youth: Apply for the fee waiver program for Sunnyvale youth and if approved, your child(ren) can receive \$234 subsidy each to register for selected summer activities and subsidized rates (30% of resident rates) for additional camps and swim lessons. Must meet the eligibility criteria (Sunnyvale resident and maximum income limit, etc.). Application links:

Free Food Distribution, Family Harvest: Families in need of food are invited to register for the Family Harvest Program, a monthly food distribution program that takes place on the last Wednesday of the month. Families drive through the CNC/CMS parking lot and volunteers load about 100 pounds of food (dry, can and fresh food) into each car with no contact. The next distribution is scheduled for Wednesday, June 23rd, 3:20 - 4:10 p.m.

Free COVID-19 Vaccines in Sunnyvale Offered by El Camino Health: Anyone age 12 and up is eligible to receive a free COVID-19 vaccine offered by El Camino Health. Sunnyvale Clinic address is 1030 West Maude Ave. Walk-in hours (no appt.) are Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.; Appointment hours are 8:10 a.m. to 4:10 p.m., Monday through Friday. Go to: www.elcaminohealth.org/schedulevax or call (408) 871-7460, additional languages (Spanish and Mandarin).

Senior Center Reopens: As of May 3rd, Senior Center (550 E. Remington Dr.) has reopened for limited in-person programs by appointment only. Residents must be registered for a class or have an appointment and an activity pass to enter the facility. Only Senior Center Members can make appointments.
