



- **Teen Wellness Fair**, Sat., 2/7/26, 12:00 – 3:00 p.m., Teens in grades 9-12 are invited to this free event, planned by high school leaders. Come learn about wellness, volunteer and employment opportunities and resources. Location: Sunnyvale City Hall, 456 W Olive Ave.
- **FREE Fun-on-the-Run (FOTR) Program for Youth, Feb. 17-20, 2-5 p.m. at Columbia Park.** Youth ages 6-11 can drop in and have fun with a variety of recreation activities. Parent/Guardian must complete an emergency card on the first day. Drop in, no registration needed or accepted.

- **Parents Helping Parents @ CNC**, Wed., 2/11, 9:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. If you are in need of resources or info. for a child with disabilities, staff with Parents Helping Parents, a non-profit organization that specializes in helping families with a child with disabilities, will be at CNC monthly, 2nd Wednesday, to assist families.
- **Free! Legal Clinic (In-Person)**, Thurs., 2/12, 1 to 4 p.m. In partnership with Asian Law Alliance, consult with an attorney on legal issue in the areas of immigration, housing, public benefits, and family law. Consultations average 30 minutes. This month, consultations will be in-person at CNC. Registration recommended, call CNC to register a minimum of 3 business days prior to clinic date. Drop in during clinic hours on 2/12 and if they can, they will take walk-ins without appointments.
- **FREE! Food Distribution @ CNC**, Wed., 2/25 – a monthly food distribution program that usually takes place on the fourth Wednesday, 4:15 - 5:15 p.m. Please do NOT line up earlier than 4 pm. New families will need to register on distribution day. A Farmer's Market model, participants must park, walk into the parking lot and bring re-usable bags for bulk produce, fruits and a cart for dry and canned goods, eggs, milk, etc. Each family will pick up about 100 lbs. of food. Location: Columbia Middle School staff parking lot, 739 Morse Avenue.
- **Zumba classes in CMS Multi-Purpose Room** – Tues. & Thurs. 6:30–7:30 pm. Adults 18+, high school students (14-17) with signed parent consent, students (age 8–13) with parent or guardian present. Suggested \$3 donation/class, no one turned away for lack of payment. No childcare; children may not wait in the facility.
- **Drop-In Fitness Room** – Regular hours - Monday - Friday, 3:30 - 8 p.m.; Saturday, 9 a.m.—12 p.m. - get active with cardio machines (treadmill, bikes, ellipticals), strength training machines and free weights. Bring water, towel and wear athletic shoes. \$1, Sunnyvale residents only. High school students with signed parent consent waiver. Middle school students are free, must attend with a paying parent/guardian. No childcare and children may not wait in the facility.
- **FREE! Youth Drop-In Basketball in CNC Gym** – Fridays, 7 – 10 p. m. - indoor youth drop-in basketball for middle and high school youth. Must have current school ID and signed parent consent form. Bring your own ball. Program will be canceled if no one shows after the first hour.
- **2026 Recreation Scholarship Program** - \$500 scholarship per youth, age 17 and under for families that qualify. Must reside in Sunnyvale and meet income criteria. Go to city website, [Sunnyvale.ca.gov](http://Sunnyvale.ca.gov), and search "Recreation Scholarship" for application and details.


